

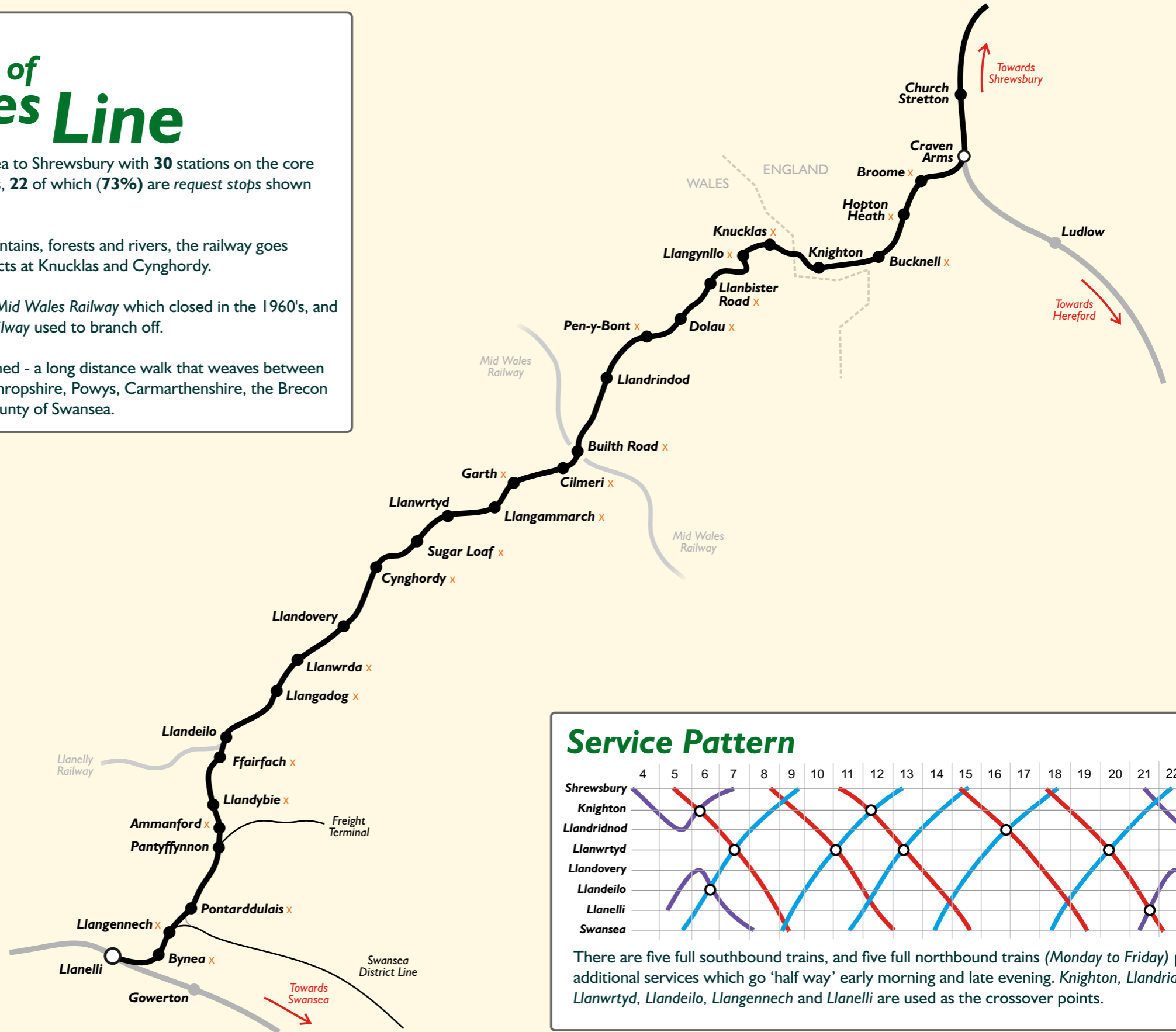
Heart of Wales Line

The Heart of Wales Line runs from Swansea to Shrewsbury with **30** stations on the core section between Llanelli and Craven Arms, **22** of which (**73%**) are request stops shown with a (x)

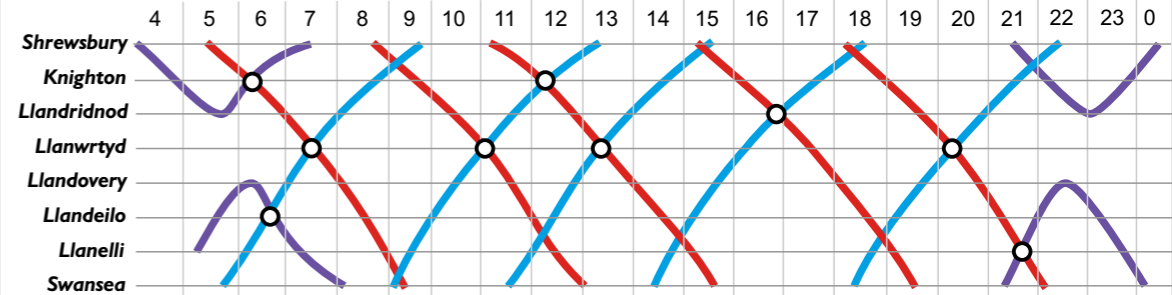
Running through dramatic scenery of mountains, forests and rivers, the railway goes through six tunnels and crosses two viaducts at Knucklas and Cynghordy.

There is an abandoned line at Builth, *The Mid Wales Railway* which closed in the 1960's, and another at Llandeilo where the *Llanelli Railway* used to branch off.

In 2019, *The Heart of Wales Line Trail* opened - a long distance walk that weaves between stations along the line. It passes through Shropshire, Powys, Carmarthenshire, the Brecon Beacons National Park, and the City & County of Swansea.



Service Pattern



There are five full southbound trains, and five full northbound trains (Monday to Friday) plus additional services which go 'half way' early morning and late evening. Knighton, Llandridnod, Llanwrtyd, Llandeilo, Llangennech and Llanelli are used as the crossover points.
