

Railways on the Isle of Man

Part of All The Stations

Isle of Man Railway

Running between Douglas and Port Erin, this 3' narrow gauge steam railway runs for just over 15 miles in the south of the island.

Manx Electric Railway

Running between Douglas and Ramsey, this is a 3' narrow gauge electric tramway that runs for 17 miles in the north of the island. It has many unofficial stopping points making it difficult to give an accurate count of how many 'stations' there are.

Snaefell Mountain Railway

Running for 5 miles up the Snaefell mountain, this 3' 6" railway takes you up to the summit from Laxey, to a height of just over 2,000 feet.

Groudle Glen Railway

This is a small 2' narrow gauge line that is less than 1 mile long, has just three stops on it, and operates seasonally during the summer only.

Not part of All The Stations

Great Laxey Mine Railway

A 19" gauge railway that runs through a tunnel as part of a mine in Laxey.

Douglas Bay Horse Tramway

Runs along the seafront by the southern terminus of the Manx Electric Railway.

Currags Wildlife Park

A multi-gauge miniature railway known as *The Orchid Line* operates within the wildlife park in the north west of the Isle of Man.
